**Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are increasing at alarming rates - especially among teens who get prescription drugs from their friends and family's medicine cabinets.**

Every day 2,500 youth age 12 to 17 abuse a pain reliever for the very first time, and more teens abuse prescription drugs than any illicit drug except marijuana.\*
