

Fall 2023 Community Survey Summary

- Over half of respondents said that **pedestrian safety/walkable environment** was the most important issue in the study area, with 20% listing it as the second most important issue.
- 80% of respondents listed **lack of sidewalks** as a safety concern and 58% listed **insufficient/missing crosswalks** as a safety concern.
- 17% currently **walk** in the study area and 9% **cycle**.
- 70% would like to **walk** and 49% would like to **cycle**.
 - Reasons why respondents do not or are discouraged from walking or cycling in the area:
 - 71% due to **lack of separation from vehicles**
 - 61% due to **lack of connectivity from other areas**
 - 46% due to **high vehicle speeds**
- 62% would use **pedestrian facilities** monthly or more if constructed.
- 38% would use **bicycle facilities** monthly or more if constructed, which is four times more than respondents reported current usage.
- In the open-ended survey responses (see presentation in binder), respondents mentioned the desire for **bicycle and pedestrian connections** to other areas, **sidewalks**, and **protected/separated bicycle infrastructure**.
