RICHMOND (August 5, 2014)—The Virginia Association of Counties (VACo) is pleased to announce the 18 recipients of the 2014 Achievement Awards recognizing model local government programs.

VACo received 61 entries with winners selected in nine categories.

Tedd Povar, Associate Director of the Virginia Institute of Government; **William Quarles**, former Goochland County Supervisor; and **Linda Lumpkin**, retired Essex County Deputy County Administrator, served as judges for this year’s statewide competitive awards program.

“This is the 12th year of the Achievement Awards program, and we continue to have high interest from our members,” said **James Campbell**, VACo executive director. “I’d like to thank our counties for their participation. This year we received 61 entries, and the competition was fierce. But I think the program’s reputation as a competitive one is spreading because the quality of the entries was top notch.”

The judges selected one submission as the “Best Achievement.” The winner of this year’s distinction is Loudoun County. This is what Lumpkin had to say about Loudoun County’s “You Belong @ Your Library” program.

“Loudoun County’s entry demonstrated what can be accomplished when volunteers in our communities and government join to help others, in this case, promoting literacy and local connections for those with intellectual disabilities, sensory integration challenges, autism spectrum disorder and physical disabilities,” Lumpkin said. “This is an awesome interactive program.”

Povar has served as judge numerous times but this is the first year the program required only electronic submissions. “VACo streamlined the process, and I think that helped increase the submissions,” Povar said. “The 61 entries are the second-most ever, which shows that many counties are developing innovative programs to address issues in their jurisdictions.”

Quarles also raved about the quality of the entries. “I’ve served as judge before and each time it is a rewarding and wonderful learning experience,” Quarles said. “I’ve been retired for a couple of years and being a judge reminded me of the great work Virginia’s counties do every day.”

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

Highlights of this year's award include Roanoke County's launch of the new Geographical Information System (GIS) website. The site contains a new generation of applications that allow greater and easier access to the County's mapping, tax parcel, zoning, and government services data. The website is powered by geo-location technology to facilitate streamlined access to data within a familiar context. The applications were developed with an emphasis on being user-friendly, intuitive and conveniently accessible to promote citizen engagement, increasing transparency and helps foster informed decision making. The applications were intentionally designed and developed to be able to access the information from any device at any location at any time. The applications are largely designed with a single focus and common interface, which creates a comfortable environment that doesn't require instruction or training.

The VACo Achievement Awards is a competitive program open to local government members of the association. Held annually, it recognizes local government programs in awards criteria that include innovation, cooperation and model practices. VACo encourages all counties, big and small, to enter the Achievement Awards Program.
